Vandiver Award Recipient
David E. Roth Speaking On:

"Behind the Scenes at Blue & Gray Magazine"

David Roth, the founder/publisher of *Blue & Gray* magazine, will discuss the founding of his publication by him and his late wife Robin in 1983. He will provide some background information on the magazine's founders, and how his interest in the Civil War and historical publishing developed. Mr. Roth will also touch on how the magazine evolved over the years, how an issue was put together, successes he achieved and the various challenges faced.

Additionally, the subject would not be complete without mentioning interesting individuals and places encountered over more

than a third of a century of publishing, favorite issues and memorable incidents, and the state of Civil War history today.

About David E. Roth

David Roth was born in Martins Ferry, Ohio. He graduated from Ohio University in 1974 with a degree in accounting, and later passed his CPA exam. Roth went on to establish *Blue & Gray* magazine in 1983 with his wife, Robin. The first issue, which focused on Harper's Ferry, came out on July 21st of that year – the anniversary of First Manassas. Since then, he went on to publish 198 issues over a 34-year span before discontinuing publication last year.


For over three decades, Roth produced the "go-to" magazine for people who love to tour battlefields. Each issue focused on a specific engagement, and contained an in-depth feature,

citations, an extensive tour section, original maps, and many photographs. *Blue & Gray* has been distinctive in its promotion of immersive experiences out in the field.

The magazine originated from Roth's hobby as a Civil War enthusiast. During the course of *Blue & Gray*'s run, several prominent Civil War authors and historians appeared in its pages.

Mr. Roth is the author of The Illustrated History of the Civil War 1861 – 1865 (1992) As announced in our April newsletter, we will proudly present the **2018 Frank E. Vandiver Award of Merit** to David Roth at our May meeting. This recognition follows the one bestowed on him last year by Emerging Civil War, the Emerging Civil War Award for Service in Civil War Public History. This award recognizes the work of an individual or organization that has made a significant impact on the field of public history in a way that better helps the general public connect with America's defining event.

Mr. Roth currently resides in Columbus, Ohio. He is the co-founder of the Central Ohio Civil War Round Table and a dedicated Civil War battlefield preservationist.

At 2 p.m. on Saturday, May 12, park staff will conduct a special guided tour of the battlefield museum that goes beyond the display text cards. Little-known facts and inside stories on the museum's artifacts, including rare uniforms, soldiers' letters and personal effects, Civil War weaponry and more will be revealed.
